Hospitality & Food Services



- Green Procurement
- a. Corporate & Supplier Code of Conduct (e.g. impact reduction targets)
- b. Seasonal & local & certified products
- Reduce-Reuse principles in most products
- a. Smaller food portions (to reduce waste)
- b. Reusable packaging for hygiene products



Waste Management (an overarching topic)

Plastics

- a. Eco design → rethinking the shape, glues, inks, and need of certain products
- b. Recycling → harmonised packaging, collection, and sorting
- c. REUSE \rightarrow reusable and biodegradable packaging



- a. Landfill ban
- b. Network of waste recovery plants
- c. Modularity
- d. Renewable and recyclable materials







Specific challenges for islands

- Even larger share of micro- and small businesses
- Seasonal fluctuation of activities
- Attractiveness for skilled workforce
- Dependence on fuel imports → especially offgrid islands
- Waste management



Specific challenges for islands

- Single-Use Plastics
 - Aim to tackle issue of marine littering
 - Our position: ban of an product only measure of last resort
 - large-scale alternatives often not available on island markets
 - Strong focus on consumer awareness especially important



Specific challenges for islands

- Waste management
 - Mentioned in CE Action Plan Implementation Report
 - Expensive infrastructure for separate waste collection
 - Shipment of waste vs. waste-to-energy
 - Issue for off-grid islands
 - Energy recovery could be suitable solution for offgrid islands
